- Engine houses and enclosed buildings like chapels, cottages.
- The remains of transport system
- You can also see museums of mining, rest at pubs and cafés



DORSET AND EAST DEVON COAST

- The first England's natural UWH site.
- "The Jurassic Coast is a 95 mile stretch of Coastline made of rocks from the Mesozoic Era. These rocks are the product of 185 million years of environmental change and upheaval, recording the evolution of life."2)



STONEHENGE, AVEBURY AND ASSOCIATED SITES

- **Stonehenge** was built somewhere from 3000 BC to 2000 BC
- **Avebury** henge constructed around 2600 BC
- Purpose unknown but some theories suggest it could serve as:
 - A temple to unkown gods
 - Astrological calendar
 - A place of healing



CANTERBURY CATHEDRAL, ST AUGUSTINE'S ABBEY, AND ST MARTIN'S CHURCH

 Mother Church of the world Communion

- Founded by St Augustine, the first Archbishop of Canterbury in 597 AD
- Completely rebuilt by the Normans in 1070 in Gothic style

 St. Martin's Church – the oldest Church in England

CITY OF BATH

- Founded by the Romans as a thermal spa, around 20 years after their arrival in 43 AD
- Centre of the wool industry in the Middle Ages
- Also listed due to the specific Gregorian era architecture (18th century)

BLENHEIM PALACE

- Built as a memoir of victory in the War of the Spanish Succession in from 1705 to 1724
- English Baroque style
- What is there to see:
 - 'State Rooms' full of portraits, tapestries and antique furniture
 - 'The Pleasure Gardens' including the giant Marlborough Hedge Maze
 - The Churchill Exhibition
