HADRIAN'S WALL

- Thee part of the 'Roman Limes' (with The Antonine Wall) – the borders of northern England and southern Scotland.
- The Romans started to built it as the frontiers of the Roman empire during the reign of Hadrian in 122 AD.

ST. KILDA

- St Kilda is Europe's most important seabird colony, and one of the major seabird breeding stations in the North Atlantic
- Stac an Armin (191 metres) and
 Stac Lee (165 metres) are the highest
 sea <u>stacks</u> in Britain
- St Kilda is one of the best places in Britainfor diving because of its clear water and its <u>submerged</u> caves, tunnels and arches
- St Kilda has one of the most extensive groups of <u>vernacular</u> building remains in Britain.

Stone circle known as Ring of Brodgar

 Skara Brae – (occupied from cca 3200 BCE to 2500 BCE)
 It consits of a number of ancient stone buildings and it is even older than Stonehenge

Parish = farnost

NEW LANARK

- Housing for workers at cotton mills
- Founded in 1786
- Symbol of the Industrial revolution
- Names associated with NL:
 - David Dale the founder, Owen's father-in-law
 - Richard Arkwright "the father of Britain's factory systém"
 - Rober Owen a <u>prominent</u> figure of utopian socialism

EDINBURGH

The capital city of Scotland

What is there to see?

• A Walk from Charlotte Square to Stockbridge – the work of James Craig remembered for his conception of Edinburgh's New Town in the 18th century



New town itself is a typical example of Georgian architecture with its roots in Palladianism and Neoclassicim

- **Dean village** in the past, it served as the centre of the milling of water mills. You can also find the Dean Gallery the Gallery of Modern art there.
- Calton Hill a hill with a beautiful panoramic view of the entire city, a famous place for both amateur and professional photographers or painters

- **The Grassmarket** is the one of the oldest part of the city with its specific architecture which offers a variety of pubs or special shops to visit
- The Royal Mile the heart of Edinburgh's Old Town. You can visit many historic buildings there like Gladstone's Land, the Writers' Museum, Mary King's Close, the John Knox House and the Museum of Edinburgh.
