CAHOKIA MOUNDS STATE HISTORIC SITE




- A great civilization of Mississippian peoples settled there before Europeans discovered American continent. (600–1400 AD).
- Cahokia was larger than London was in AD 1250.

What is there to see?

- museum exhibit galleries, an orientation show theater, a public programming auditorium, museum shop etc.
- self-guided tours, guided tours, trails and the 100 ft high Monks Mound, the largest earthwork in North America ¹⁾



CHACO CULTURE



- National Historical Park in northwestern New Mexico.
- A major centre of ancestral Pueblo culture between 850 and 1250 AD.
- *“Chaco is remarkable for its monumental public and ceremonial buildings and its distinctive multi-storey “greathouses” which demonstrate a sophisticated understanding of astronomical phenomena. They are linked by an elaborate system of carefully engineered and constructed roads.“ 2)*

TAOS PUEBLO



- The main part of the present buildings were most likely constructed between 1000 and 1450 AD
- Nowadays, around 150 people live within the Pueblo full time. Currently there are over 1900 Taos Indians living on Taos Pueblo lands.
- Languages spoken are Tiwa, English and Spanish
- They are considered to be the oldest continuously inhabited communities in the USA.



MESA VERDE



- Mesa Verde means “green table“ in Spanish
- There are nearly 5,000 known archeological sites, including 600 cliff dwellings.
- The park was created in 1906 by President Theodore Roosevelt, to protect some of the best-preserved cliff dwellings in the world, or as he said, "*preserve the works of man.*"⁴⁾
- Tips for plces to visit: Balcony House and Long House, Cliff Palace or Mesa Verde reservoirs

BELL FACTS, HOW IT CRACKED

- “A bell for the Pennsylvania State House was cast in London, England, however, it cracked soon after it arrived in Philadelphia. Local craftsmen John Pass and John Stow cast a new bell in 1753, using metal from the English bell. Their names appear on the front of the bell, along with the city and the date. By 1846 a thin crack began to affect the sound of the bell. The bell was repaired in 1846 and rang for a George Washington birthday celebration, but the bell cracked again and has not been rung since. No one knows why the bell cracked either time.”⁵⁾
